

## **Book Discussion Guidelines**

## **For Book Discussion Participants**

- 1. Begin with positive comments. Try to express what you liked most about the book and why. Everyone should have a chance to speak.
- 2. Avoid recapping or summarizing the book. It is assumed that everyone has read it.
- 3. The discussion should be about the book and the ideas it raises. Share your personal experiences as they relate to the book, but be brief.
- 4. Not everyone will agree with your ideas. Disagreements should be discussed respectfully. Keep an open mind, and carefully listen to opinions other than your own.
- 5. Respond to the comments of others, rather than merely waiting for an opportunity to share your comments.
- 6. Discuss aspects of the book that did not appeal to you or that you found difficult to accept. Difficulties should be expressed as questions, rather than statements.
- 7. Talk with the discussion participants rather than to the discussion facilitator.
- 8. Discuss with the group as a whole, rather than with someone next to you.
- 9. Most important of all, enjoy the discussion!
