

#### **Farewell**

Almost 40 years ago in a first issue produced on a manual typewriter, duplicated on 10 sheets of colored paper, stapled, and passed out by hand, *New Books on Women and Feminism* (as this publication was called then) gathered information on selected books that had been reviewed in publications such as *Ms.*, *Signs*, *Choice*, the *Chronicle of Higher Education*, and the *New York Times Book Review*. Its 103 entries included classics by Joan Didion and Mary Daly, Catherine A. MacKinnon's *Sexual Harassment of Working Women: A Case of Sex Discrimination*, novels, poetry, and an array of other material.

Back then getting the word out about noteworthy titles was the guiding principle, and we began this project by collecting as many works by, for, and about women as possible. Initially this task was manageable even when issues had grown to 100 or so typeset pages. With today's plethora of material, we determined that narrowing our scope would not only better serve the academic and library communities but also enable us to more readily identify appropriate books about women, women's rights, feminism, and gender. Now we focus on works for researchers, scholarly editions, noteworthy memoirs, and books of significance aimed at a general audience.

Most items in this issue were published during 2017 and 2018. We present relevant bibliographic information readily available from books received, reviews in academic journals and feminist periodicals, publishers' websites, Books in Print, OCLC, and other online resources. Each title is listed once under a primary subject category, and selected entries include annotations to help clarify a book's scope or general content. Where possible, we note the dissertations, art exhibitions, and academic conferences that served as origins of these published works.

This issue also marks a milestone for *New Books*. Since providing timely and useful content has been our ongoing mission, this is the final print version of this resource. Current subscribers can contact us to receive a pdf of this issue (newbooks@library.wisc.edu). Note that issues dating back to 2010 are available as pdf downloads on our website (bit.ly/2DxRqET), and other pdfs from the archive can be accessed through MINDS@UW (bit.ly/2yXIpDa).

In 2019, New Books—under a new name—will launch as an open–access database with robust search options, numerous methods to identify titles of interest, and featured items. Content will be added regularly, and over time selected material from our archive will be included. Additional announcements about this free resource will be made as the release date approaches. Until then, we welcome your suggestions about the future version of New Books and how it can better meet your needs. We hope to continue disseminating information about scholarship and notable works that inform and educate about women's lives for 40 more years.
