Basically a chronology of American women's history since 1900, this volume also features nearly eighty biographical sketches, fourteen short essays, and photographs. Designed for general use, it lacks footnotes or bibliographies.

An international, multilingual bibliography of over 2,600 published journals, diaries, and letters by women, arranged alphabetically by author; about a thousand are indexed under "United States."

This bibliography boasts nearly five thousand entries for women's autobiographies, travel accounts, letters, and diaries, including such specialized genres as spiritual autobiographies and captivity narratives. Only works published in book form are included. The index provides access by occupations, geographic locations, personal convictions (e.g., spiritualists, social reformers), types of experiences (e.g., world tours), and types of works (e.g., childhood reminiscences, memorial volumes).

This bibliography describes American women's diaries and letters later published as books (by both mainstream publishers and private presses) or magazine articles (including many drawn from state and local history journals). It is arranged chronologically from 1669 to 1982 and is augmented with author and subject indexes.

Features an excellent subject index.

All but the shortest entries conclude with one or more bibliographic citations.
